## Free Care Convening Meeting

- June 2015
- Reps from CMS, USDOE, districts, vendors, Trust for America's Health, Healthy Schools Campaign
- Goals of meeting:
  - -Utilize recent CMS clarification of free care policy to identify opportunities to improve children's health in school setting
  - -Determine changes needed at local and state level to leverage benefits
  - -Identify strategies for working with decision makers about recent clarification and how to use it increase health services in the school setting

## **Meeting Overview**

- Free care policy overview/content-Melissa Harris, Acting Deputy for the Disabled and Elderly Health Program Group, CMS
  - Previous CMS guidance: Medicaid payment generally not available for services that are provided without charge to everyone in a community ("free care policy")
  - Challenged and USDHHS Department Appeals Board concluded policy not in Medicaid statute or existing regulations
  - Schools are biggest stakeholder impacted
  - Door is open to bill for health services delivered in schools-not just services in the IEP
  - Services will vary by state and states might need a SPA
  - CMS not likely to issue additional guidance
  - CMS will support colleagues at USDOE should they develop and disseminate guidance
  - CMS is meeting with USDOE to discuss the free care policy clarification
  - Change applies to the student population that does not have an IEP

## Free Care Convening Meeting-Next Steps

- Identify few states to serve as early adopters
- Develop principles outlined by attendees into framework for guiding efforts to implement change in the free care policy
- Create list of questions that school district or stakeholder group should ask before moving forward with implementation of the change
